Take part in your child's daily devotional & NextGen Lesson

Reviewing Memory Verse

Take a couple of minutes to review the memory verse for the month after each lesson. Take a moment to go over it with your child and repeat. (Kind of like shampoo.) As you go through the week, remind your child about it and maybe review it at dinner time. Ask your child what they think it means! The more we fill our heart with God's word, the more ammunition we have to fight off fear and anxiety!

How to discuss the lesson with your child.

We know one of the obstacles parents can face is how exactly do I create dialogue with my child without it feeling forced or awkward. Below you will find a few starter questions that you can ask to get your child to start the dialogue about the lesson they just watched.

- 1. What part did you like the most and why?
- 2. Who were the main characters in our story today?
- 3. What's one thing that stood out to you about the story?

PRAYER:

- 1. If they haven't done so yet, ask your child if they want to say yes to Jesus' love and accept him into there hearts.
- 2. Ask Jesus to show you and your child how valuable you are to Him.

 Ex. "Jesus, thank You for making us. You searched for us when we were lost in sin. Then You gave up everything so that we can live our whole lives in relationship with you."
